Describe the steps you intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives:

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 10)

We are committed to upholding the four licensing objectives and ensuring a safe, respectful, and compliant environment for our clients and staff. Our measures include:

- Staff Training: All staff involved in the sale of alcohol will be trained in the Licensing Act 2003, including the prevention of underage sales, responsible alcohol service, and conflict management.
- Challenge 25 Policy: A strict Challenge 25 policy will be implemented, requiring customers who appear to be under 25 to present valid identification before alcohol is served.
- Alcohol as an Add-on: Alcohol will only be served as an accompaniment to beauty treatments and will not be available as a standalone service. This ensures moderate consumption within a controlled environment.
- Monitoring: The premises will be monitored to ensure compliance with the licensing conditions and the safety of all individuals on site.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

To prevent crime and disorder, we will implement the following steps:

- CCTV Coverage: The premises will have CCTV cameras installed to monitor all
 areas where alcohol is consumed. CCTV footage will be stored for the required period and made available to authorities if needed.
- Alcohol Service Control: Alcohol will only be served to clients receiving beauty treatments, and no excessive alcohol consumption will be encouraged.
- Trained Staff: Staff will be trained to deal with potentially disorderly behaviour and conflict. Any incidents of concern will be recorded, and the relevant authorities will be notified as necessary.
- Refusal of Service: Alcohol will not be served to individuals who are visibly intoxicated or behaving in a disorderly manner.

c) Public safety

We take the safety of our clients and staff seriously and will ensure the following steps:

- Capacity Limit: The premises will operate within a maximum client capacity of 10 individuals at any one time, ensuring that the environment is controlled and safe.
- Safety Measures: Fire safety regulations will be strictly adhered to, with fire exits
 clearly marked and accessible at all times. Fire extinguishers and first aid kits will
 be maintained on the premises.
- Clear Walkways: The layout of the premises will ensure that walkways are clear and free from obstruction, reducing the risk of accidents.
- Alcohol Moderation: Alcohol consumption will be moderate and controlled, avoiding excessive intoxication and the associated safety risks.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

To prevent any public nuisance, we will take the following steps:

- Noise Control: Background music will be unamplified and kept at a low level, ensuring that no disturbance is caused to neighbouring businesses or residents.
- Waste Management: Proper waste disposal systems will be in place to ensure that no littering or unsanitary conditions result from the sale of alcohol on the premises.
- Client Behaviour Management: We will ensure that clients behave respectfully
 when arriving and leaving the premises. Any disorderly conduct outside the premises will be dealt with appropriately.
- Operating Hours: The sale and consumption of alcohol will only occur during the salon's regular operating hours, avoiding late-night disturbances.

e) The protection of children from harm

We are fully committed to protecting children from harm and will take the following steps:

- Challenge 25 Policy: A strict Challenge 25 policy will be in place, meaning that
 any individual who appears to be under the age of 25 will be required to present
 valid identification (such as a passport, driving license, or PASS card) before being
 served alcohol. This will prevent underage drinking on the premises.
- Accompanied Children: Children will only be allowed on the premises if accompanied by an adult, and alcohol will only be consumed by adult clients as part of their beauty treatment experience.
- Controlled Environment: The premises will be a controlled and professional environment, ensuring that children present (e.g., with their parents/guardians) are not exposed to any inappropriate behaviour, excessive alcohol consumption, or adult content.
- Staff Training: All staff will be trained on the legal requirements concerning the sale of alcohol to minors and how to handle situations where minors are present on the premises. This will include conflict management and refusal of service protocols.

- 8. If you wish people to be able to consume alcohol on the premises, please tick 'on the premises'. If you wish people to be able to purchase alcohol to consume away from the premises, please tick 'off the premises'. If you wish people to be able to do both, please tick 'both'.
- 9. Please give information about anything intended to occur at the premises or ancillary to the use of the premises which may give rise to concern in respect of children, regardless of whether you intend children to have access to the premises, for example (but not exclusively) nudity or semi-nudity, films for restricted age groups or the presence of gaming machines.
- 10. Please list here steps you will take to promote all four licensing objectives together.
- 11. The application form must be signed.

- 12. An applicant's agent (for example solicitor) may sign the form on their behalf provided that they have actual authority to do so.
- 13. Where there is more than one applicant, each of the applicants or their respective agent must sign the application form.
- 14. This is the address which we shall use to correspond with you about this application.
- 15. Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships:
- A licence may not be issued to an individual or an individual in a partnership which is not a limited liability partnership who is resident in the UK who:
 - · does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
 - is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have the right to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

They do this in one of two ways:

- by providing with this application, copies or scanned copies of the documents which an applicant has provided, to demonstrate their entitlement to work in the UK (which do not need to be certified) as per information published on gov.uk and in guidance.
- by providing their 'share code' to enable the licensing authority to carry out a check using the Home Office online right to work checking service (see below).

Home Office online right to work checking service.

As an alternative to providing a copy of original documents, applicants may demonstrate their right to work by allowing the licensing authority to carry out a check with the Home Office online right to work checking service.

To demonstrate their right to work via the Home Office online right to work checking service, applicants should include in this application their share code (provided to them upon accessing the service at https://www.gov.uk/prove-right-to-work) which, along with the applicant's date of birth, will allow the licensing authority to carry out the check.

In order to establish the applicant's right to work, the check will need to indicate that the applicant is allowed to work in the United Kingdom and is not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

An online check will not be possible in all circumstances because not all applicants will have an immigration status that can be shared digitally. The Home Office online right to work checking service sets out what information and/or documentation applicants will need in order to access the service. Applicants who are unable to obtain a share code from the service should submit copies of documents as set out above.

Your right to work will be checked as part of your licensing application and this could involve us checking your immigration status with the Home Office.

We may otherwise share information with the Home Office. Your licence application will not be determined until you have complied with this guidance.
